

Phase IV of the Master Plan begins... Restoration and Preservation of the Library and Caen Stone Hall

The Engineering Society of Baltimore and Garrett-Jacobs Mansion Endowment Fund are stewards of the Garrett-Jacobs Mansion, this priceless jewel in the crown of Baltimore's most distinctive home and public buildings. Their stewardship protects the Mansion's Golden Age legacy and adds to the overall significance of the Mount Vernon Historic District.

To date, three phases of the Plan have been completed: the adaptive restoration of the Courtyard and restoration of the Drawing Room and Ballroom.

The Master Plan, when fully realized, will rehabilitate the historic rooms, revive their original grandeur, and enable more visitors, tourists, and preservationists to immerse themselves in Baltimore history and architecture. Every year more than 30,000 members and visitors assemble at the Mansion for professional, social, cultural, educational, and civic meetings.

- Repair plaster ceiling and faux wood finish above tablature.
- · Restore wood surfaces.
- Upgrade mechanical/electrical systems.
- Install fire protection sprinklers.
- Refinish and repair floor.

Cost: \$300,000



- Repair plaster ceiling.
- Restore and repair cast stone walls and decorative elements
- Restore and gild railings.
- · Repair marble.

Cost: \$400,000

The Master Plan also takes the Mansion into the future. Plans call for making the Mansion functional and accessible for public use and skillfully adapting



the building to manage events that generate significant earnings for future preservation and maintenance. The improvements enhance the Mansion's revenue-producing potential. To protect the building's historic fabric, a new vertical addition will be constructed at the back of the building to provide elevator access to four floors and restrooms for the disabled.
